Description: The Minor in Criminal Justice (CJUG) offered by the Department of Sociology will give students an operational knowledge of the three branches of the criminal justice system: policing, the courts and corrections/rehabilitation. The minor will also expose them to the major demographic forces that shape the criminal justice system in the United States and beyond.
