The Sociology Honors program offers exceptional majors a more rigorous curriculum. The Honors curriculum is fully integrated within the General BA Sociology program. It requires that 15-credit hours of the student's Sociology and Criminal Justice courses have an Honors designation. The Sociology degree at Norfolk State investigates many distinctive perspectives of the social world. The discipline prepares students for social services and criminal justice post-graduate careers, which is a natural alignment for studying law. The students' Honors designation will be granted by the Robert C. Nausbaum Honors College as they will provide guidance and mentorship to the scholars.
