American Sign Language (ASL) is the language of Deaf people in the United States. "American Sign Language is a visually perceived language based on a naturally evolved system of articulated hand gestures and their placement relative to the body, along with non-manual markers such as facial expressions, head movements, shoulder raises, mouth morphemes, and movements of the body." Introductory course in American Sign Language (ASL) emphasizes conversational skills which includes basic sentence structure of ASL, finger spelling and numbers. Classroom work stresses practice of conversational ASL, both expressive and receptive; also, introduces to the American Deaf Culture and Health Care Signs that will be utilized in the field
