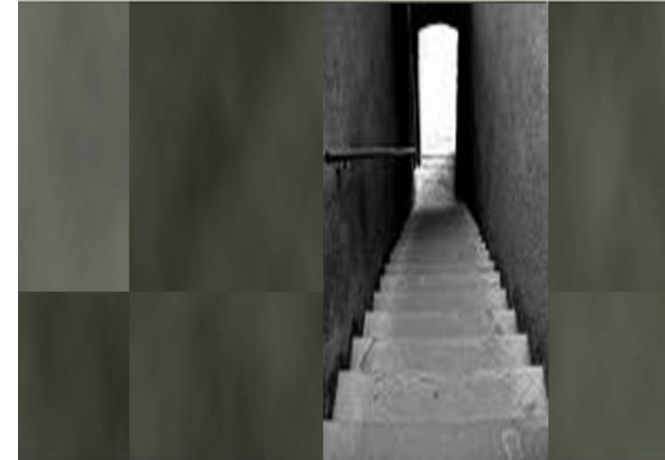

GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (GED)

The mission of Norfolk State University (NSU) is to provide an affordable, high quality education for an ethnically and culturally diverse student population, equipping them with the capability to become productive citizens who continuously contribute to a global and rapidly changing society.

In accordance with our mission, we are excited to offer General Educational Development (GED) preparatory classes.

The GED is a national examination developed by the GED Testing Service of the American Council of Education. Successful completion of the GED exam is widely recognized by colleges, technical schools and employers as an equivalent to a high school diploma.

The Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE), a skill level test, is administered to determine students readiness for the NSU GED preparatory course. Qualified instructors provide one-on-one and group instruction in all five areas of testing; writing skills, social studies, science, mathematics, and literature and the arts.

The School of Social Work Outreach Services offers support to each student through the course of the 16 week academic semester.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

APPLICANTS...

- Must be 18 years of age or older.
- Must be residents of Hampton Roads.
- Must complete the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE), at the 7th grade level or higher.
- Must attend the Student Orientation
- Must pay the \$25 non-refundable course fee prior to the first class.
- May not be currently enrolled in school.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where do I go to take the GED exam?

After completion of the prep course, students are referred to the Madison Career Center for testing. (757) 628-3413

How can I best prepare for the exam?

Study on your own, complete course homework as assigned and participate in class discussions.
