Norfolk State University students recently participated in the **4th Annual Know Your Heritage: Black College Quiz Bowl** in Chicago, Illinois. The NSU team won the \$10,000 grand prize

which will be used for scholarships at NSU.

The Black College Quiz Bowl show encourages the appreciation of African-American Heritage by all people in an exciting quiz show

format. The quiz show series objective is to generate a high level of excitement and enthusiasm by featuring HBCU college students from around the country showcasing their knowledge.

NSU WINS 6TH MEAC ALL-SPORTS AWARD

NSU has won its sixth straight Talmadge Layman Hill Award.

This marks the first time a MEAC men's program has won six straight all-sports

awards. Each winning school receives \$20,000, meaning NSU has totaled prize winnings of \$145,000 over the past six years.

NSU became the first men's program

to sweep the indoor and outdoor MEAC track championships in five consecutive years.
