A total of 102 student-athletes from Norfolk State University have earned a spot on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll for the end of the 2010 term. The high number of student-athletes on the Honor Roll is a great testament to our Athletics Department and the caliber of students in our program," said Kim Luckes, acting president of Norfolk State University. To earn this distinction, student-

athletes must have achieved at least a 3.0 grade point average for the semester.

SUMMER ALTERNATE SCHEDULE

In an effort to reduce energy costs, reduce fuel consumption for commuters, and lessen the University's carbon footprint on the planet, NSU for the third consecutive year will implement a 4-day work week during the summer semester. The 4-day work week begins Monday, May 9, 2011 and will end on Friday, July 29, 2011. The

University will be open from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

In addition to the benefit of the concentrated time off, the University continues to find ways to protect the environment. The alternate schedule has proven to conserve energy and reduce cost. The first year during this three month period, NSU used

approximately 950,000 less kilowatt hours and avoided a cost increase of about \$62,800.
