## Speaker's Biographies

**Keynote Speaker: *Major General Jaap Willemse, Royal Netherlands Air Force, Assistant Chief of Staff, Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance, NATO Allied Command Transformation.***

Major General Jaap Willemse has over 30 years of experience in military and international affairs in the service of his country and NATO. He has been a fighter pilot, combat leader, base commander, and a senior staff officer in national and international organizations. In 2006, General Willemse became Vice Chairman of the NATO Air Defense Committee responsible for oversight of the NATO Air Defense Policy and the NATO Air Command and Control System. In July 2009, he assumed his present position at NATO Allied Command Transformation. He will discuss ongoing NATO activities around the world, and evolving intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance requirements and enhancements.

**Featured Speaker: *Lowell (Jake) Jacoby, Executive Vice President, CACI International, Inc.***

Vice Admiral Lowell (Jake) Jacoby, USN (ret.) is the former Director of the Defense Intelligence Agency. He currently serves as Executive Vice President of the National Solutions Group (NSG) of CACI International Inc, an information technology and network services company providing a broad range of support to the military and intelligence communities. Admiral Jacoby will summarize broad operational and intelligence trends and the wide skill sets required in the future intelligence workforce.

***Ms. Christyl Johnson, Executive Director, National Science and Technology Council, Executive Office of the President***

Ms. Johnson joined the White House Office of Science and Technology Council in November 2008, and serves as the Executive Director of the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC). The primary objective of the NSTC is the establishment of clear national goals for Federal science and technology investments across the executive branch. She came to the White House from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, where she served as the Assistant Associate Administrator of the agency. In this role, she and the Associate Administrator provided oversight of the agency's technical mission areas and field center operations.

***Mr. Sunjay K. Nair, Program Manager, IC-CAE, ODNI.***

Sunjay K. Nair is currently on a two-year Joint Duty Assignment from the Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI) to the Intelligence Community Centers for Academic Excellence (IC CAE) Program in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI). He is also a commissioned officer in the United States Navy Reserve, and currently serves as the Operations Officer for Defense Intelligence Agency HQ 0466, a Joint Chiefs of Staff J2 supporting unit at the Pentagon. Prior to this, he served as the Department Head for both Administration and Intelligence for NATO Component Command One, a NATO ACT supporting reserve unit based at Andrews AFB, MD. In his current role with the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, Mr. Nair provides IC program management oversight to five IC CAE Institutions: Florida A&M, Howard University, Miles College, Penn State, and Virginia Tech.

***Mr. James D. Lawrence, Senior Program Manager, IC-CAE, ODNI.***

Mr. James D. (Doug) Lawrence has over thirty-eight years experience with intelligence programs, operations, planning, programming, budgeting, analytical, training and collection areas. Mr. Lawrence recently rejoined government service as a Senior Program Manager on the Office of the Director of National Intelligence/Intelligence Community Centers of Academic Intelligence (ODNI/CAE) staff. As a member of the CAE staff he is responsible for all contracts, budgets and programming for CAE and related programs. He is also responsible for the IC Colloquiums, planning, and budget related to future universities participating in the CAE program.
