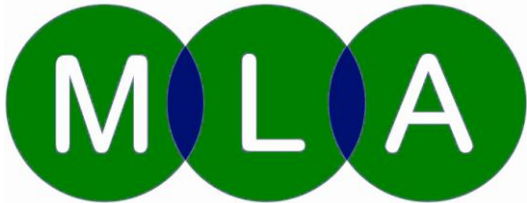

- ➔ **List of Works Cited begins on a separate page.**
- ➔ **Heading, centered, is typed 1 inch from top of page.**
- ➔ **List is alphabetized by author's last name.**
- ➔ **5 space (1/2 inch) indentation on second and subsequent lines of each entry. Double space throughout.**
- ➔ **If no author, list citation by title**
