ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

1. A baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited four-year college or university, or the equivalent from a foreign country
2. A minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) on undergraduate coursework
3. Three letters of recommendation from persons capable of adequately assessing the applicant's potential of success in the program
4. Resume
5. Letter of Intent

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION:

Applicants who do not qualify for regular admission will be evaluated on a case by case basis.
